## FAQ & Guidelines for visitors of FABRIC DAYS based on the Bavarian state government hygiene concept for trade fairs

### 1. What are the general measures to reduce the risk of infection?

In general, the minimum distance of 1.5m to other persons must be maintained, which is made possible by floor markings, appropriate aisle widths and guided directions. In general, the obligation to cover your mouth and nose applies to the entire interior area of the exhibition grounds, see also question 2. Sufficient hand washing and hygiene facilities are provided.

### 2. Is there a general obligation to wear a mouth and nose cover?

In general, the obligation to wear a mouth and nose cover applies to all persons throughout the entire interior area of the trade fair. This does not include tables in separate catering areas and cafés, provided that the minimum distance can be maintained. Mouth and nose covers may be removed in the outdoor area of the fair as long as the distance rule of 1.5m can be maintained.

### 3. How is the implementation of the hygiene measures ensured?

Thanks to the restriction of the exhibition space to the easily accessible Halls 1 - 4 on the ground floor of the MOC, the switch to purely digital ticketing and the controlled access of only professional industry professionals, contact points are minimised and crowds of people are avoided. Exhibitors regularly disinfect the work surfaces within their own stand areas. The event organiser is responsible for the regular cleaning and disinfection of contact surfaces outside of stand areas as well as ensuring continuous fresh air circulation.

### 4. How will the organiser inform about the protection and hygiene measures?

Shortly before the exhibition, you will receive a newsletter with detailed information about the current protection and hygiene measures that have been taken by the organiser and need to be considered. On site, suitable media and measures as well as specially trained personnel will also point out the precautions.

### 5. Will there be wider aisles in the halls, one-way systems or guided directions?

The aisle widths in the halls are adapted to the flow of visitors, so that one-way systems are not necessary. There will only be guided directions at the entrances, exits and hub areas.

### 6. How many people are allowed per stand?

Due to the general obligation to wear a mouth and nose cover, there are no restrictions on the maximum number of people per stand. However, the current 1.5m distance rule applies.

### 7. Are hand disinfectants provided?

The organiser provides a high density of disinfection and hand washing facilities on the premises. Furthermore, exhibitors provide hand disinfectant for people within their stand.

### 8. Is there a limited number of visitors allowed on the MOC site or in the exhibition halls?

There is a maximum number of people who may stay on exhibition grounds for the event. However, with the planned hall layout, we will not exceed the specified guidelines. Therefore, no restrictions on visitor numbers are to be expected.

### 9. Do the contact details have to be given anew at each stand and in the catering areas?

For reasons of possible traceability in the event of an infection, a contact detail collection is necessary in catering areas.

### 10. Access restrictions for trade fair visitors, exhibitors & participants:

Trade fair visitors, exhibitors and participants who have had contact with positively tested COVID-19 patients in the last 14 days, who are infected with COVID-19 or who show the known COVID-19 symptoms, are kindly asked to take their responsibility and stay away from the show. This also applies to persons who are under domestic quarantine. Persons with symptoms of illness will not be granted access to the fair.

#### Our recommendations:

Use the CORONA-WARN-APP of the German government during your stay in Germany. The Corona-Warn-App helps to determine whether you have come into contact with an infected person and whether there is a risk of infection. In this way, chains of infection can be interrupted more quickly. Download and use of the app is completely voluntary. It is available free of charge in the App Store and can be downloaded from Google Play.
